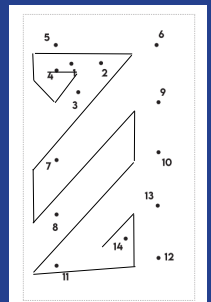


**MUSÉE DÉPARTEMENTAL BRETON
QUIMPER**

The palace is L-shaped. The wing with the museum entrance dates from the 17th century (1645). The tower has several windows with a pointed arch above.



For sleeping in. It is a 'closed-in' bed.



This pattern is on a sideboard.

Corentin was Bishop of Quimper

His daughter, Dahut, who gave the devil the keys of the city.

The secret code to open the box is :

- The number of windows with a pointed arch (not including those bricked up) : 7
 - The number of rooms in the bishop's private apartments : 4
 - The number of diamond shapes on the Rohan family coat-of-arms : 7
 - The number of beams which divide up the wooden palm-shaped ceiling at the very top of the tower 24
- (add together the two digits to get the final digit for the code) 2 + 4 = 6

Note the code number here : 7 4 7 6

The thieves are the little Korrigan (Breton pixies) dancing in the moonlight on the platter called « Le biniou et les Korrigan / Légende Bretonne » (Breton bagpipes and Breton pixies / a Breton Legend) made by Faïencerie Porquier-Beau Pottery in Room 10.
