#### Welcome to the Musée Breton!

Barzaz Breiz is a book containing lots of songs collected by Théodore Hersart de La Villemarqué 200 years ago!

Théodore went from village to village and listened to people singing. Then he wrote down the words and music in his notebooks: he was a collector.


This exhibition presents the different themes found in the songs: Breton legends, the history of Brittany and the everyday life of its inhabitants.

Look at the art works (pictures, sculptures, drawings, etc.), listen to Theodore and in particular the songs of *Barzaz Breiz*.

## GO UP TO THE SECOND FLOOR TO START THE GAMES IN YOUR BOOKLET.



There are just a few rules to follow in the museum:

- don't go too close to the art works
- don't touch them
- don't mark anything with your pencil

- have fun, look at everything, dream, walk around, backwards and forwards
- ask questions
- you don't have to look at everything!











#### **2ND FLOOR: BRETON LEGENDS**

Here you can discover the Breton legends found in the songs of Barzaz Breiz. They are stories which people used to tell one another. They are inspired by true or imaginary stories. Many songs from Barzaz Breiz are still sung today by performers and artists base paintings and sculptures on them.



1. Plug your headset into the music station opposite the pictures by BRAUNWALD about the City of Ys and listen to the songs (you don't have to listen all the way through).

The instrument you can hear is a harp.

Put a ring round the right answer.












4. All of the works in this room feature legends found in *Barzaz Breiz*. Each character is shown with a symbol: an object or an animal which allows you to recognise him.

#### **2<sup>ND</sup> FLOOR: THE HISTORY OF BRITTANY**

All the songs here are laments (gwerzioù in Breton). These are long, often sad and brutal songs which recount the history of Brittany.

They contain many strong, brave characters.

**6.** Put a circle round the coats-of-arms in the picture The Combat of the Thirty.




































If you had a coat-of-arms, what would it be like?








10. This machine was used 200 years ago to plough the fields.


